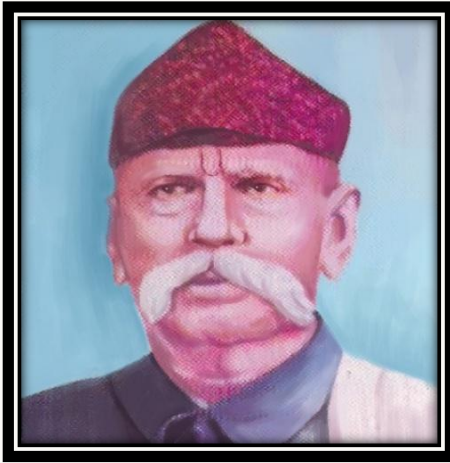

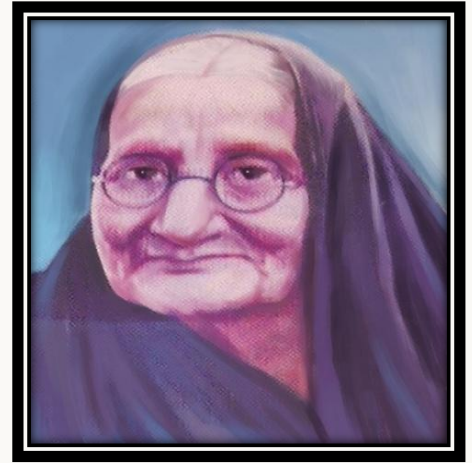

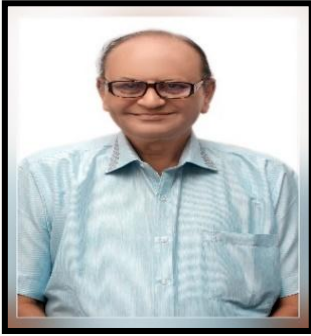

Message From The President of Ramji Assar Vidyalaya Committee



This is a true story of one man's determination and the collective efforts of like-minded philanthropists devoted to the noble cause of imparting education to the next generation. Today, these efforts have turned into a magnificent educational institution- RAMJI ASSAR VIDYALAYA.

Sheth Shri. Ramji Assar established a primary co-education school in June 1911 with 17 students, which included one girl student. The very fact that this was a co-education school was again a rare phenomenon in those days. After the demise of Shri. Ramji Assar, his wife Smt. Navibai Ramji Assar took upon herself the noble work of educating the future generation. By 1925, Ramji Assar Vidyalaya rose to its secondary school.

In the year 1928, Shri. Morarji Vasanji Balamandir started to impart education based on the Montessori system in Gujarati medium with just six students. In the year 1952, Pratap Singh Ranchhod Das School of Commerce started imparting education in vocational commerce subjects, perhaps one of its kind in the schools of Mumbai.

With the changing scenario and with English medium gaining popularity, Ramji Assar Vidyalaya gave an option to the Gujarati medium students of std. VIII to select English or Gujarati as their medium of instruction. This led to the birth of Ramji Assar Vidyalaya English Medium Secondary School in the year 1965 and Ramji Assar Vidyalaya English Medium Primary School. In the year 1972, we were fortunate in having a generous donor Shri. Dharamsy Morarji Bhatia to start a full-fledged English medium secondary school, which was named after his wife, Smt. Manibai Dharamsy Bhatia. In the year 1975, the Primary school was named after Shri. Dharamsy Morarji Bhatia.

By this time, the need for a Junior college led to the formation of H.V.K. Tanna College of Commerce in the year 1986 and which further grew into a senior college in the year 2009, in the name of Shri. Laxmichand Golwala College of Commerce and Economics.

The horizon of learning is endless, the avenues myriad, and we can only hope that in our humble mission, we provide an adequate base for every child to discover their capabilities. In the hustle of life in a crowded world, we develop children's individual potential so that they find their own groove in the endless possibilities life has to offer, which should leave their mark not on sand, but on stone. Moving with time, we have a new building with new infrastructure to cater to the needs of the changing times, like a well-equipped library, modern laboratory and interactive board in every class.

I feel proud to note that the 'M. D. Bhatians', as popularly known and are excelling in all fields. The young cricketers had been winners of the Harris Shield and Giles Shield. I am sure that the publication of ‘M. D. Bhatia Magazine’ will be a very effective medium to showcase the talents of the students and also to educate the community on a large scale. Congratulations to the budding writers, the editors and the principal Mr. Pankaj Agarwal who has taken the efforts.
